


Dear Parents,

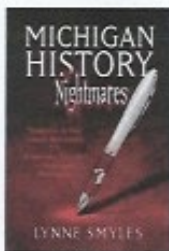

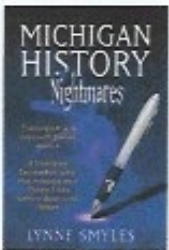

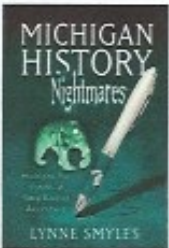
Michigan History Nightmares (vol. 1)

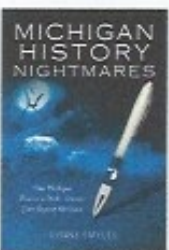
Michigan History Nightmares (vol. 2)
